The Principal hereby authorizes and empowers the Customs Representative to act on the Principal's behalf in carrying out customs formalities within the European Union in accordance with the **Union Customs Code (Regulation (EU) No 952/2013, "UCC")***.

Accordingly, the Principal grants a power of attorney to the Customs Representative to, as a **direct representative**, declare goods for all customs procedures and perform any other action necessary to fulfil customs obligations.

The Principal is responsible for ensuring that the information provided to the Customs Representative is accurate and complete. Should any costs or claims arise affecting the Customs Representative as a result of incorrect or incomplete information attributable to the Principal, the Principal undertakes, in dialogue with the Customs Representative, to contribute to ensuring that such matters are handled in a proper and reasonable manner. Such costs or claims may include customs duties and other indirect taxes, such as value added tax (VAT) and excise duties, as well as any related charges or interest.

The Principal further undertakes to cooperate with the Customs Representative in order to, as far as possible, limit and manage any claims. Where such claims relate to amounts that are recoverable by or creditable to the Principal, including VAT or excise duties, the Principal shall reimburse the Customs Representative for such amounts.

***Legal basis for the authorization/power of attorney:**

In accordance with Article 18 UCC, which states that a person has the right to appoint a customs representative, and Article 19 UCC, which stipulates that the representative must be duly empowered to legally act on behalf of the principal.

The Principal undertakes and is responsible towards the Customs Representative to:

1. Provide complete, accurate, and timely information, records, and documentation required for customs handling.
2. Ensure the accuracy of information relating to product description, classification, customs value, origin, licences, permits, and other regulatory requirements.
3. Notify the Customs Representative of all relevant information affecting compliance, including (but not limited to) CBAM, EUDR, REACH, dual-use, and sanctions requirements.
4. Bear full financial responsibility for duties, taxes, charges, sanctions, and any administrative penalties arising from incorrect information or lack of compliance.

Applicable Law and Jurisdiction

This power of attorney shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of Sweden, excluding its conflict-of-law rules that would refer the matter to another jurisdiction.

Any disputes, controversies, or claims arising from this power of attorney that cannot be resolved amicably between the parties shall be handled by the ordinary courts of Sweden, with the District Court of Gothenburg as the agreed venue.

Validity and Termination

This power of attorney is valid from the date of signature and shall remain in force until terminated in writing by either party. Termination does not affect rights or obligations already incurred.
